### SITUATION OF FARM

The farm is situated on the B4231, 1.5 miles East of Redbrook, 3 miles South of Monmouth off the A466 Chepstow to Monmouth road, and 1/4 mile North of the village of Newland which straddles the B4231. Both Monmouth and Coleford are within about 10 minutes drive.

We are in an ancient meander of the valley of the River Wye. Since the last ice age 16,000 years ago both Severn and Wye rivers started flowing south as a result of being damned by retreating ice, forming the now extinct Lake Lapworth in Cheshire. This acted as a watershed and made the two rivers find alternative routes south, causing the river to cut various courses as it chiselled its way down through the limestone and quartz conglomerate rocks.

### ACTIVITIES

For adventures further afield, such as walking on the Brecon Beacons and the Black Mountains, Wales and its mountains are only 1 hours drive away. A visit to the recently opened Hopewell Freemine at Cannop Hill, near Coleford is worthwhile. Canoeing, rock climbing, abseiling, mountain biking and a host of other activities are available near the farm.
